

Senior School

We provide a variety of authentic and effective learning opportunities designed to develop soft skills such as problem-solving, communication, teamwork, self-motivation and the ability to work under pressure. A broad range of sporting, cultural, service and outdoor learning experiences complement the curriculum, to further develop life skills, resilience, and

Middle School

Years 5 to 8 offers a dynamic learning environment tailored to the needs of young adolescents. As the students move through the Middle School, they are given the opportunity to make connections with their learning.

Our program aims to inspire creativity, develop independence and resilience, as well as support cooperation and achievement, while ensuring engagement and enjoyment from learning. Students gradually have more choice in determining what and how they prefer to learn, with a view to encouraging them to take responsibility for their own learning.

Junior School

Anglesea Village is for students Kindergarten to Year 4. These years of schooling are such a special and important time in a child's life. It is a time of great growth across all areas of development and our teachers play a pivotal role in this.

Our curriculum is designed to support the holistic development of each child including academic, spiritual, physical and social development. The class Mentor has the responsibility for the pastoral care of each student, as well as teaching many of the core subjects such as English, Mathematics, Science, History and Geography. This is extended by specialist teaching of Chinese, Faith and Life, Music, Art, Physical Education and Outdoor Education.

Advantages of a Girls' School

Years 7 and 8 Curriculum

The Middle School program is aligned with the Australian Curriculum and offers the core subjects of English, History, Geography, Mathematics and Science. All year groups also take part in Faith and Life, Health and Physical Education, Languages and an increasing number of electives in the Expressive Arts or Project Based Learning areas. All subjects are led by specialist teachers who have a genuine passion for their learning area.

Students are able to choose from a wide range of cocurricular activities including Music, Art, Dance, Drama, Sport, Debating and Public Speaking, Clubs and EDGE (Enrichment, Differentiation and Gifted Education).

Years 9 and 10 Curriculum

A challenging core academic program covering English, Mathematics, Humanities, Science, Religion and Philosophy and Health and Physical Education is offered. All subjects follow, and are assessed against, the Australian Curriculum.

The elective subject program is combined in Years 9 and 10. Students can choose an individual learning program depending on their interests, passions and strengths. This ensures that different types of learning experiences are available for all students.

The elective program includes:

- Languages (Chinese and French)
- Expressive Arts including Music, Dance, Drama, Textiles, Art and Graphic Design
- Integrated subjects combining two or more faculties across many subject areas
- STEAM / STEM learning opportunities
- More in-depth and focused learning in a subject area
- Project Based Learning opportunities where students are encouraged to take ownership of their learning and pursue individual learning programs.



Years 11 and 12 Curriculum

Our aim is for all international students to leave school with an ATAR that allows them to further progress their study at Australian Universities. We provide opportunities for all students to attain the certification by achieving the necessary standards as outlined by the Office of Tasmanian Assessment Standards and Certification (TASC).

Collegiate students in Years 11 and 12 can access:

- Level 2, 3 and 4 TASC accredited subjects on campus along with opportunities at The Hutchins School, our brother school.
- Subjects offered through the University of Tasmania Connections Program.
- Academic English support lessons for EAL/D speakers.

Pathway Planning is an extensive individual Pathway Planning and Careers program with our Educational Counsellor and is offered to every student, including supporting students with their university application.

Support for Learning is provided in the Curriculum Skills class for Years 9 and 10 and the Study Centre for Years 11 and 12. Each week there is Mathematics tutoring after school.

Cocurricular activities include 27 different sports, music ensembles, choral, debating, musicals and public speaking.


Boarding at Collegiate
