Responding to Incidents, Disclosures, and Suspicions of Child Abuse – Four Critical Actions

You Must Take Action

As a volunteer / staff member in your organisation you play a critical role protecting children and young people. You must follow the four actions below.

If a child / student is at risk of immediate harm you must ensure their safety by:

- Separating alleged victims and others involved
- Administering first aid
- Calling 000 for urgent medical and/or police assistance to respond to immediate health or safety concerns
- Identifying a contact person at for future liaison with Police.

If there is <u>no</u> immediate harm go to Action 2

<u>Any incident</u> must be <u>documented</u> on the Child Abuse Incident Report Form

to Strong Families Safe Kids Advice and Referral Line as required. You must also report internally to the Deputy Principal who then needs to report to Human resources, Principal, COO, Board and the Australian Childhood Foundation.

Report to the police or

You must consult with Strong Families Safe Kids Advice and Referral Line or local police to determine the information that can be shared with parents / carers. The School will be guided by Tasmania Police regarding the process of investigating allegations of abuse.

This can include:

- Not to contact the parents / carers in circumstances where they have alleged to have engaged in the abuse or the child is a mature minor and does not wish their parent/carer to be contacted.
- To contact the parents

 carers and provide
 agreed information as
 soon as possible.

Your organisation should provide support for children impacted by abuse which could include: the development of a safety plan, direct support and/or a referral to wellbeing professionals.
